






SURRY HILLS, "CULTURAL HUB"

The Teachers Federation Building in Surry Hills is situated in an area renowned for its vibrant food and art scenes. 
URBAN FLOW & CONNECTIVITY

The Teachers Federation Building in Surry Hills is strategically positioned near major and secondary roads, providing excellent access and connectivity. The site is located near Cleveland Street, a major arterial road that connects the area to key parts of Sydney, including the CBD and eastern suburbs. Cleveland Street facilitates easy vehicular access, though it can experience heavy traffic during peak hours.

Secondary roads like Reservoir Street and Elizabeth Street offer additional access points, with Elizabeth Street running parallel to Central Station, enhancing public transport options. Central Station, Sydney's largest transport hub, is within walking distance, providing access to trains, buses, and light rail services. This proximity to Central Station ensures seamless connectivity to the broader Sydney area, making the site highly accessible for both employees and visitors.

Pedestrian access is also well-supported, with the surrounding streets being highly walkable. Additionally, there are several nearby bike lanes, promoting cycling as a conveyance option. However, the area faces challenges with parking, as on-street parking is limited, and traffic congestion is common on main roads. Despite these challenges, the site's accessibility via multiple modes of transport makes it a highly connected and convenient location.







ENVIRONMENTAL ORIENTATION & NATURAL FORCES

The orientation of the Teachers Federation Building in Surry Hills plays a significant role in its interaction with natural elements like sunlight and wind. The building is oriented with its main facade facing south towards Reservoir Street, which helps minimize direct sun exposure, reducing heat gain during the hotter months. However, this also means that the building receives less natural light, particularly in winter.

The sunpath in Surry Hills generally moves from the east to the west, with the northern facade receiving the most sunlight throughout the day. This orientation can be leveraged for passive solar heating in winter, while shading devices may be necessary to control heat during summer.

Wind directions in Surry Hills predominantly come from the southeast, with occasional strong gusts from the southwest. The building's southern exposure means it can be affected by these winds, particularly during colder months, making it important to consider windbreaks or other design elements to mitigate discomfort and improve energy efficiency.


The concept of my hotel is rooted in the essence of "LAYERS".




O3 MID CENTURY MODERN RESIDENCE
