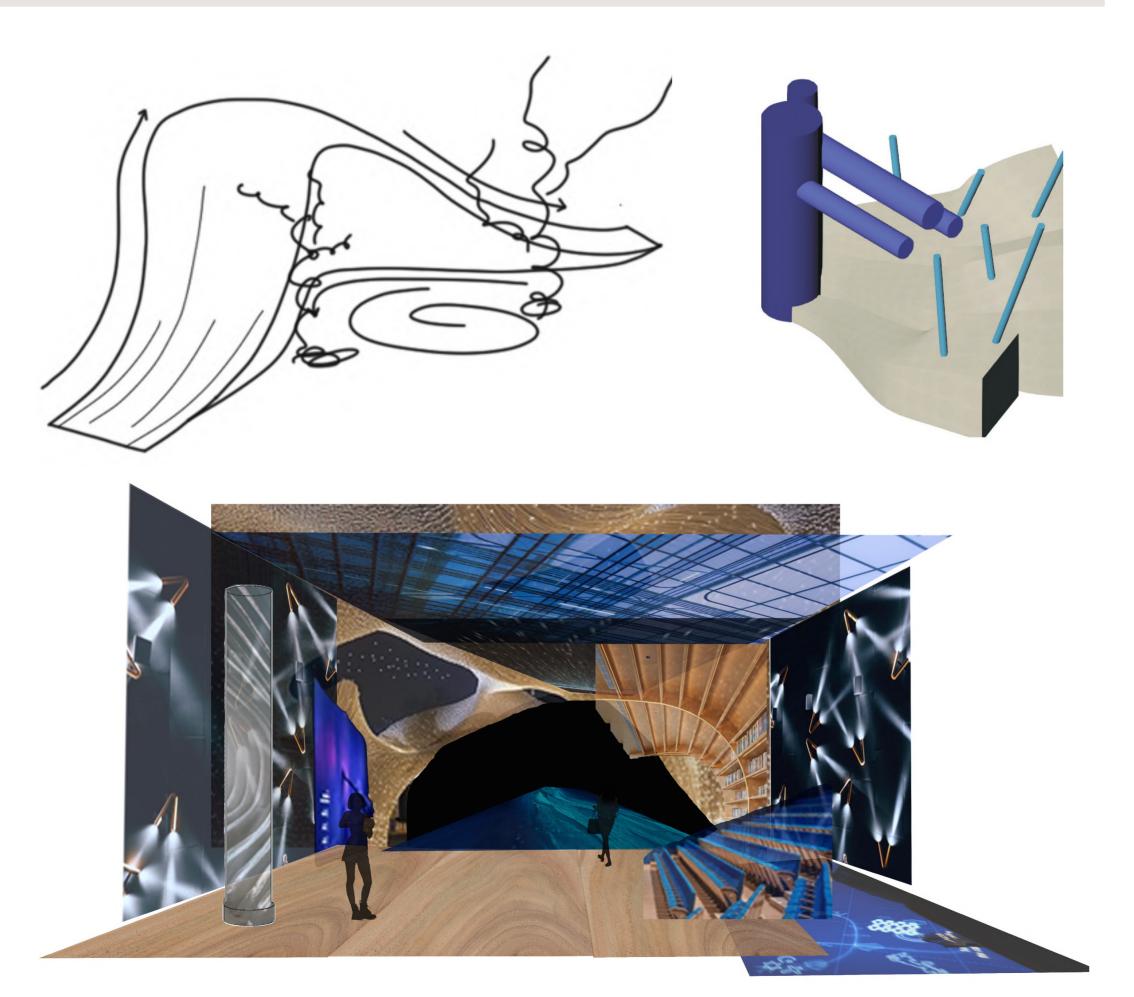

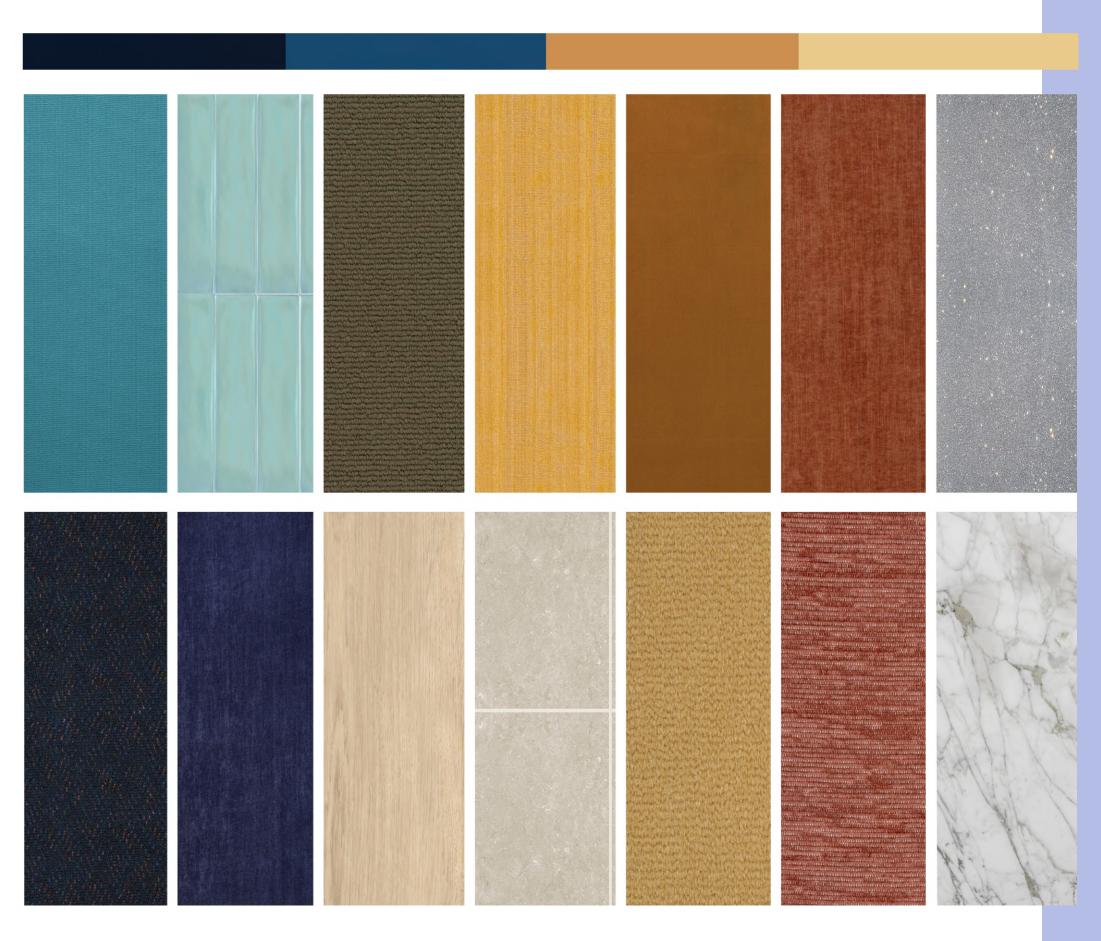
CONCORDIA

Concordia is an adaptive-reuse proposal for the Gunnamatta Pavilion in Cronulla, designed to mend the long-standing cultural tensions between the Sutherland Shire and the Canterbury-Bankstown community while celebrating the richness of diversity. The project responds to the legacy of the Cronulla riots and the ongoing social tension between both communities by creating a shared environment based on common interests: community and family, where people can reconnect through culture, storytelling, and collective experiences. Concordia brings together entertainment, community, and education within a multifunctional space that includes an interactive museum, a community library, flexible museum area, and auditorium for talks, performances, and cross-cultural events.

The design is grounded by drawing inspiration from sand dunes Cronulla and the structural design responding to curved geometries and linear elements to reflect people and their ability to learn. Materiality is heavily influenced by place: locally sourced white oak and colour palette reflects sand, sea, and vegetation of Cronulla.

STUDIO 4 YEAR 3 HOSPITALITY ERSKINEVILLE

Acoustic reimagines the legacy of the acoustic guitar; an instrument that has evolved over 3,500 years to produce different sounds and been responsible for allowing small artists to produce any sound. Acoustic re-adapts the Swanson Hotel, an unbandoned hub of entertainment to create a new entertainment and studio space using the fundamentals in "Six & Hollow". It's located in Erskineville, a suburb celebrated for its creative energy, family culture, and LGBTQ+ inclusivity. Acoustic is designed for emerging artists and those who enjoy discovering new talent.

The interior draws inspiration from the structure of an acoustic guitar, using timber, plasterboard, and textured brown fabrics to echo the warmth of its sound. Each level represents a part of the instrument: the head projects the music outward, the body creates rhythm and tone, and the internal core becomes the heart where sound is produced and shared. Bespoke joinery, custom bottle lighting, and layered acoustics work together to create an inviting, intimate environment that celebrates creativity and connection

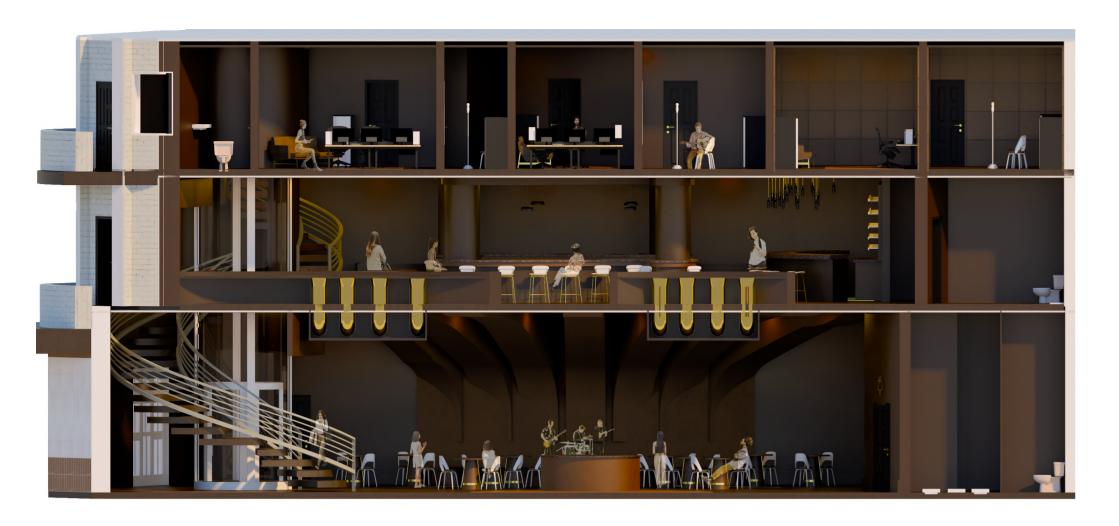


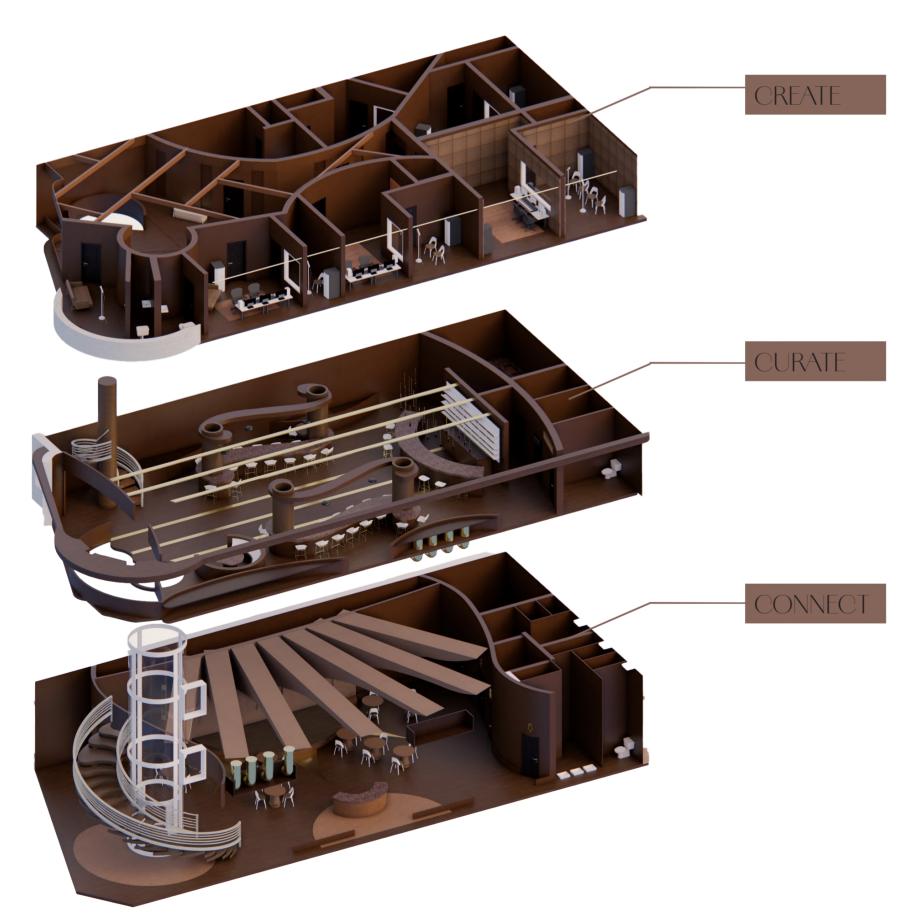

ACCLIMATE

Acclimate is a socially responsive housing project inspired by the Sirius 2.0 movement, created to provide temporary and long-term accommodation for disadvantaged families seeking medical treatment. Located near Circular Quay, the design reimagines the legacy of the original Sirius building; once built for low-income and disabled residents by transforming two existing modular concrete blocks into supportive and adaptable living spaces.

The accomidation is tailored for families of two to five people with one member having a long-term illness. They would be seeking treatment in the city and need a temporary but long term place to stay. Acclimate integrates modular design principles to ensure flexibility and comfort. Adjustable seating and storage units, movable walls, and partial partitions allow residents to modify the layout to suit individual needs, such as creating a private bedroom for a family member undergoing treatment. The bathroom is designed for accessibility, with generous circulation space and digital shower controls. Warm tones of orange, yellow, cream, and white are used to introduce a creating a calm, non-sterile environment that promotes healing and a sense of home while navigating this difficult time.

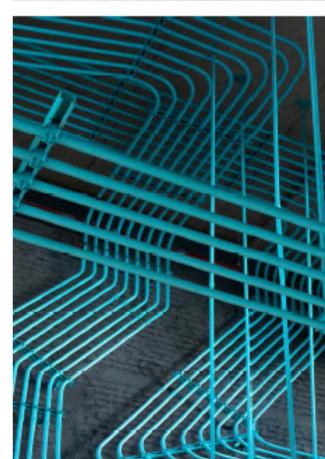

The Autodesk Workplace project reimagines the future of office design by integrating flexibility, technology, and collaboration. Autodesk's headquarters are located within Deutsche Bank Place at 126 Phillip Street, Sydney, occupying Levels 19 and 20. The design reflects the company's innovative identity through a geometric language that combines triangular and square motifs across the reflected ceiling plan and spatial layout. The interior expresses Autodesk's geometric branding through the use of angled and linear wall forms, furnishings, and ceiling details. The space includes a mix of hot desks, collaborative zones, and private meeting rooms to support diverse work styles. A refined monochromatic palette of chrome, white, black, and grey is accented with vibrant tones drawn from the Autodesk logo, reinforcing the brand's dynamic and creative ethos.

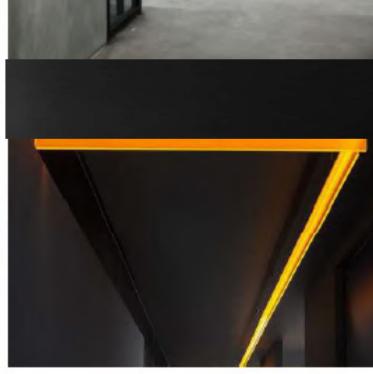


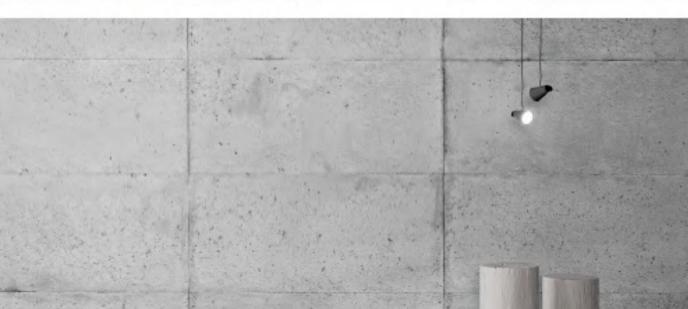


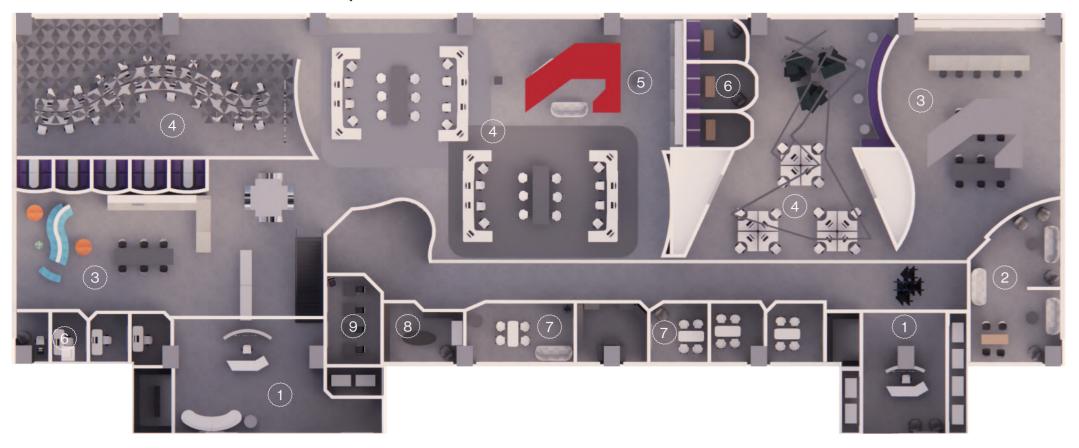












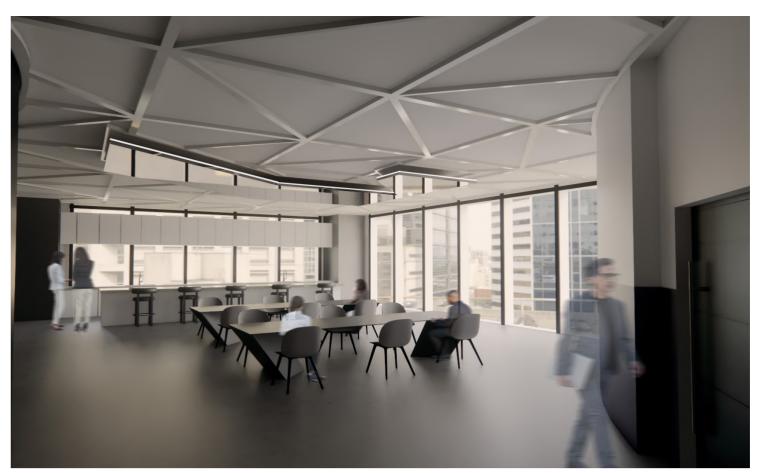

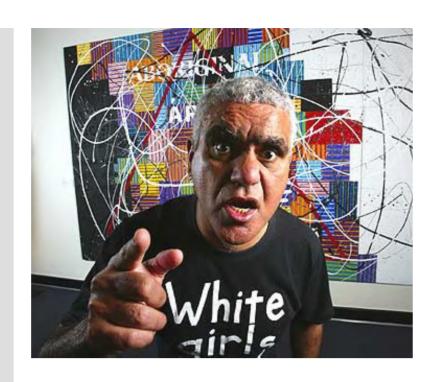




STUDIO 3 CULTURE YEAR 2
EXBINITION AUSTRALIAN PAVILION

Richard Bell is an Australian artist of Aboriginal heritage renowned for his provocative and politically charged works in painting, installation, and performance. His practice confronts themes of colonisation, systemic racism, and the influence of Western media on Aboriginal identity, often using satire to critique the art world's treatment of social and cultural issues.

The Australian Pavilion, managed by Creative Australia, serves as a contemporary and flexible exhibition space defined by presenting shocking and provoking art each year. The design Recalibrate pokes fun at the trauma response; "fight or flight". Visitors are first met with stereotypical "Aboriginal art" colours of blacks, oranges, reds, and yellows and under warm, subdued lighting. Turning the corner, the space narrows into an angled, blue-and-white zone with intense cool toned lighting, evoking discomfort, and reflection through a powerful sense of confrontation. Recalibrate challenges audiences to reconsider their perceptions of the distorted narratives surrounding "Aboriginal history" and to reflect on the ongoing impacts of cultural tension and identity in contemporary Australia.

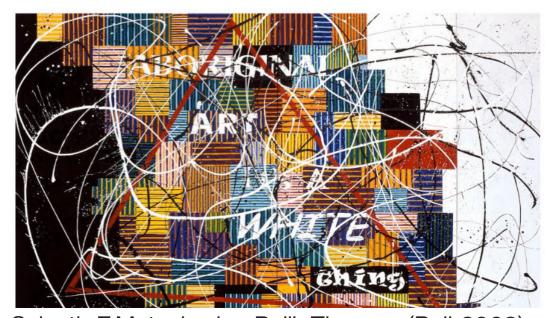
